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Coding and casemix classifications

204.1 ICD-10-AM/ACHI/ACS edition for 1 July 2016

All separations occurring on or after 1 July 2016 must be coded using:

- ICD-10-AM/ACHI Ninth Edition (and relevant errata) in accordance with the Ninth Edition Australian Coding Standards
- Victorian Additions to the Australian Coding Standards 2016-17

204.2 ICD-10-AM/ACHI Library file 2016-17

The ICD-10-AM/ACHI Library file contains all ICD-10-AM [diagnosis] and ACHI [procedure] codes, along with the age, sex and other edits (validations) applicable to each code, and logical one-to-one backward mapping to previous editions of ICD-10-AM/ACHI.

The following updates have been made to the 2016-17 ICD-10-AM/ACHI Library file:

- Edits related to Prefix A have been removed as this prefix has been removed from 1 July 2016
- The 1st high age for selected diagnoses and procedures related to obstetric conditions has been raised to 65 in line with advancing maternal age
- The Sex edit on selected codes related to breast conditions and procedures has been removed in recognition that these conditions and procedures can apply equally to males as they do to females
- The OR column has been updated in accordance with AR-DRG Version 8

The Library file is available to Victorian hospitals and software suppliers working with Victorian hospitals for the purpose of submitting data to the Victorian Admitted Episodes Dataset (VAED). Requests can be made via the HDSS Helpdesk at: HDSS.helpdesk@dhhs.vic.gov.au

204.3 National ICD-10-AM/ACHI/ACS advice

The Australian Consortium for Classification Development (ACCD) publishes coding advice in the ICD-10-AM/ACHI/ACS Coding Rules on a quarterly basis.

204.4 Acute admitted services funding for 2016-17

Separations occurring on or after 1 July 2016 will be grouped in PRS/2 using AR-DRG Version 8.0.

The Australian Refined Diagnosis Related Groups Version 8.0 Definitions Manual is available for purchase from the IHPA. Refer to the AR-DRG classification system sales page on the IHPA website at:

Victorian amendments to the classifications

204.7 Victorian additions to the Australian Coding Standards

The 2016-17 Victorian additions to the Australian Coding Standards must be used in conjunction with the Australian Coding Standards for the Ninth Edition of ICD-10-AM/ACHI.

The following changes have been made to the document from last year:

Vic 0048 Condition onset flag: Prefix A has been removed to enable Victorian prefixes to be more accurately aligned with the national Condition Onset Flag (COF).

Vic 2104 Rehabilitation: *Vic 2104 Rehabilitation* has been removed because it is redundant as all the information in this Vic Addition is provided in ACS 2104 Rehabilitation.

204.8 Victorian modifications to the AR-DRGs

In 2016–17 hospitals will assign diagnosis and procedure codes using the ninth edition of the ICD-10-AM / ACHI classifications. For funding purposes, these codes will be grouped to AR-DRG version 8.0 (AR-DRG8.0) with no mapping required.

As in previous years, some adjustments will be made to the original AR-DRG8.0 grouping utilising the VIC-DRG8.0 field prior to the calculation of WIES23. The VIC-DRG7.0 for Radiotherapy under WIES22 will be included as a VIC-DRG8.0 under WIES23.

Australian Coding Standard (ACS) 0229 Radiotherapy instructs coders to assign a code for the malignancy as the principal diagnosis in multi-day episodes for radiotherapy. This results in episodes grouping to a wide range of AR-DRG 8.0s.

To maintain funding equity, a VIC-DRG8.0 of R64Z Radiotherapy will be assigned for:

- i. (non-same-day non-surgical episodes that include a radiation oncology procedure from ACHI blocks [1786] to [1792], [1794] or [1795] for treatment of a neoplastic condition (at least one code from the ICD-10-AM range C00-D48), except for episodes with the following adjacent AR-DRG8.0s: B61; and pre-MDC adjacent AR-DRG8.0s: A40, B60, B82, S65, W60, and W61;

And for

- ii. same-day episodes initially grouped to the adjacent AR-DRG8.0 R62 Other Neoplastic Disorders that have an ICD-10-AM ninth edition principal diagnosis code of Z51.0 (Radiotherapy session).

204.9 2016-17 VAED criteria for reporting

In addition to the name change there has been some re-sequencing of information and the fact sheets have been fully incorporated into the document as Appendix One

Only episodes meeting a Criterion for Admission, as set out in this document, may be reported to the VAED. This applies to VAED reporting for all Victorian public and private hospitals and registered day procedure centres.

The following changes are in place for 1 July 2016:

- Transfer of the following Ninth edition codes from the NAQAL to the AAPL
 - 36851-00 Endoscopic administration of agent into bladder wall
 - 36561-00 Closed biopsy of kidney
- Further clarification of Criterion for Admission E, Day only extended medical care
- Expansion of the notes at Criterion for Admission N Qualified Newborn to align with the VAED business rules (see VAED Manual, Section 3, Qualification Status)

204.10 Performance Indicators for Coding Quality (PICQ™)

The Department of Health & Human Services has an enterprise licence with Pavilion Health to provide PICQ™ statewide benchmarking information to both public and private hospitals and monthly numerator to public hospitals.
